The Gospel of John tells us that the day after Jesus dies on the cross, Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb very early in the morning, while it is still dark, and finds that the stone has been removed from the tomb. She is very distressed that the body of her Lord is missing. She runs to tell Simon-Peter and John. They run to the tomb to see for themselves, and they don't have any more explanation than Mary Magdalene has for where the body has gone.

Mary Magdalene then lingers outside the tomb crying. When she looks up from her tears, she sees a figure standing nearby. She assumes it is the gardener. It is only when the person says her name, "Mary," that she realizes it is Jesus.

For Mary, this is the moment the resurrection happens. All the stories of the resurrection of Jesus tell us that no one was there to witness the event. God rose Jesus from the dead when no one was around to watch. The resurrection becomes real only when the people who love Jesus have an encounter with him, alive and well, although scarred. They speak with him, they eventually touch him, they eat meals with him.

When Mary hears her name spoken by the one who loves her, she knows that her Jesus lives on. Death does not have the last word.

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you....You are precious and honoured in my sight, and I love you," says the Lord. (Isaiah 43: 1, 2, 4)

That is the promise of Easter – that you do not need to fear death or loneliness, or sickness, or separation, or mistakes, or indeed, anything at all. God's promise is for everyone. You have been redeemed through the love of Christ, for you are precious and loved.

She has graciously agreed to speak about her experiences, and what is needed to support the Ukraine and the citizens that remained to fight for their home with the aid of translator, Maria Stebelsky, Vice President of the Ukrianian-Canadian Social Services.
