
Dear Friends,

I was privileged to be a commissioner at The United Church of Canada's 43rd General Council in July. The General Council meets every three years, and addresses all kinds of petitions and proposals which come before it from across the church.

The General Council also elects the Moderator, who will be the head of the church for the next three years. We elected Rev. Richard Bott, who ministers in Vancouver, and who is also a graduate of Queen's Theological College.

His first sermon as Moderator was titled, "The Church is Hungry for Change," and was based on John 6: 1-14, the story where Jesus feeds 5,000 people with five barley loaves and two small fish. Richard Bott said in his sermon, "The hungry crowd listening to Jesus was hungry in so many ways, hungry for freedom; hungry for a deeper connection with each other; and with God." He continued, "Today, these same kinds of hungers 'are apparent in the streets, in the news stories, in our social media, in our families, in the loneliness and brokenness of so many people's lives."

Christ offers food in the midst of this hunger. Strange as it may sound, Christ cannot offer this food by himself. In the story from John 6, he depends on the offering of a child. "The child was hungry and was not part of the inner circle.", Richard says. "The child offered what he had, knowing that he might stay hungry...The child is us at our best, and the child is the world at its best; when we are ready to offer without having any idea what the end result might be – trusting that what God does with the gift, and with us, will be enough to satisfy the hunger, the

Did You Know?!

As part of our on-going celebration of Deseronto's 150th Anniversary, we are continuing our trivia section with some interesting tid-bits about the church building and it's inhabitants:

- In 1896, two-thirds of the east side of Deseronto was destroyed by fire. The Rathbun Company's flour mill, storehouse, and elevator; the shingle and lumber docks; the Roman Catholic Church; and almost one hundred homes were destroyed in the blaze. Deseronto United Church (or the Wesleyan Methodist church at the time) was not harmed, but the manse was not as lucky. Another house, across from the church on Fourth Street was purchased and moved to Thomas Street.
- On March 25, 1905 a combustion fire began due to some oily rags in the custodian's closet. The closet was at the bottom of the stairs currently leading to the balcony and the base of the church tower. The fire quickly moved up the tower, burning off the spire and totally gutting the tower. There was a small amount of damage to the church which was covered by insurance, however, the spire on top of the tower was never replaced.
