ORDINATION


On Sunday, June 2, 2019, East Central Ontario Region of the United Church of Canada ordained four new ministers.

'Our' candidate, the candidate from Grace United Church, Napanee, was Megan Jones. For the act of ordination, she kneeled in front of the church, and church officiants and her chosen family members gently placed their hands of blessing on her head or shoulders, and she heard these words: "Megan, with a humble and joyful heart, know that you are part of the long line of Christ's Ministers called and set apart to serve God. Holy Spirit, come sweep Megan off her feet, and dance with her through her days. May your Holy Spirit continue to be with her, and move in this moment, that she may rise an Ordained Minister of your Church. Amen." She received gifts, a chalice and paten, prayer shawl, Bible, as well as small tokens presented by the children and youth at conference. She was given the certificate which will proclaim to anyone who chooses to glance at it, that this was the day she was formally set apart to do God's work. When she stood, the church full of 300 or so worshipers sang, "Halle-Halle-Hallelujah..." and broke into spontaneous applause.

Now Megan and her three newly ordained colleagues will go out into the world in the name of Christ, and do their best for Christ, for the church, and for the world.

It is a hugely challenging role. I sometimes wonder what in the world compels a person to take this step in our cantankerous and secular day and age. They are taking their place as leaders of a denomination which is clearly in decline; all across Canada, churches are closing at an alarming rate. Most churches are filled with aging congregants, with young people few and far between. My generation has seen a huge shift in attitudes towards religion; the fastest growing category of religious affiliation is 'none'. Many younger Canadian citizens have never been inside a church, let alone have the foggiest idea what Christian discipleship is.

So, why in the world do this?
