A HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH

On May 28, 2023, we celebrated the festival of Pentecost. This is the day in the church year when we remember the out-pouring of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus. They had watched Jesus die, discovered that he was alive again, had many encounters with the risen Jesus over 40 days, then watched him leave them again. He had promised that the Holy Spirit would come to give them power and the courage to witness to him. Every Pentecost, we read the story of what happened from Acts 2:1-21.

This year, to remind us of the power that the Spirit brings, the church was decorated with red helium balloons, table cloths with red flames on them, and streamers waving gently in the breezes. Thank you, Siobhan, for the decorations. We were delighted to receive four people as new members: welcome Rodney Rogalsky, Steven Lindsay-Maracle, Susan Munro and Roberta Partridge. We also celebrated Holy Communion. It was a special time of worship and grace.

When the four membership candidates spoke of why they were choosing to become a member at this time, they all said that they found Grace United Church to be a church which welcomed them and included them. I was greatly touched by their words. I thank the whole congregation for making this church a place where four people have found a faith home. I pray that we may continue to be welcoming and inclusive.

Side by side with this good news story, we also recognize that the number of people participating in the life of the church continues to decline, and those who are here are mostly senior citizens. Our church, along with Selby United Church and Trinity United Church, have embarked on a series of conversations to consider how we can most effectively be "the United Church of Greater Napanee." Not three separate churches, but a unified church, presenting a unified message to the Napanee community. At this stage, we are mostly talking and getting to know one another. I am part of these

discussions, as well as dedicated and skilled lay person, Dave Remington. We are not yet making any plans or coming up with strategies. We hope plans and strategies will emerge over time.

In the meantime, please pray for these discussions. It is not easy to imagine a future different from what we have been as a church, but it seems to be necessary. There is a note of hope in these

conversations. We do not know where we may end up, but we trust that things will become clear over time. We trust in the power and courage of the Holy Spirit.

MESSAGE FROM OUR FINANCE AND STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

I would like to send a big thank you to everyone in our congregation. Thank you for your continued financial support to Grace United Church as well as the support you provide in so many other ways. I know it has been said before, but it bears repeating, it is the people who make the Church. It's not the building, but the people who sit in the pews each week that make us the Church we are.

I think Grace Church is a Church that we can be proud of. If you were at our Pentecost service on May 28th, you would have heard a new member that joined our congregation, emphasize what a welcoming congregation we are.

We are currently running a deficit of- \$25,782.60 at the end of April 2023. Although I would like to see a lower deficit for this time of year, we had an even greater deficit of- \$35,561.47 at the end of April in 2022. By the end of December 2022, we ended the year with a deficit of \$25,454.63. All this to say that as much as I would like to see a lower deficit, I know as a congregation you do what you can to try to balance our books by the end of the year.

Each year it is getting more challenging. The Finance and Stewardship Committee has been trying to find ways of reducing our expenses. Unfortunately, everything from fuel, utilities, and insurance has been increasing in recent years. Last year we had a major repair to our elevator which was a big expense in 2022.

There is also a new group that is meeting on a regular basis to discuss the future of our Church. The meetings are announced in the bulletin and are open to anyone who would like to attend. All ideas are

welcomed.

We have also been searching for someone to replace our current Treasurer, Bert Needham. We have had several leads, but none of them have proved successful. We are quickly realizing that it will not be easy to replace Bert. If anyone knows of someone who would be a possible candidate for our next Treasurer, please let us know.

On a more positive note, we have had a couple good fundraising events so far this year. Our spring roast pork dinner in April brought in over \$3,000.00. Our 50's/60's music concert brought in over \$800.00. And, on June 17th, 2023, we have Mary's Merry Minstrels performing a concert. The tickets are \$10.00 each. It should be a fun event. I hope everyone will come out a support this event.
